9:00 – 9:50	<b>BW Phillip –Level 3–Inflammatory Responses in Contact Lens Wearers</b> There are many complications that the contact lens wearer may experience; complications that are either directly induced or complications that represent existing problems aggravated by the contact lens wear. The mechanisms by which the contact lenses induce alterations are: trauma, decreased corneal oxygenation, reduced corneal and conjunctival wetting, stimulation of allergic, inflammatory responses & infection.

This course will review the most common systemic medications and discusses their ocular side effects. Opticians should be able to understand how disease & medications can have an effect on their patient's visual outcome.	<b>Charlie Saccarelli – Technical - 20/20 Vision – A Sacred Cow?</b> Gaining basic understanding of peripheral vision, color vision, and other aspects of vision that can’t be measured by a traditional acuity chart.
